Primary Objective: To Evaluate the Long Term Effects of (>4 years) of Losartan Compared to Atenolol in Hypertensive Patients with Documented LVH.
2. A Comparison of Efficacy of Mibefradil with Losartan in Patients with Mild to Moderate Hypertension
3. ABC Study of Hypertension: Efficacy of Candesartan in Hypertensive Black Patients
4. A Double-Blind Efficacy and Safety Study of Two Doses of Baycol (cerivastatin) and Pravachol (pravastatin) in the Treatment of Patients with Primary Hypercholesterolemia
5. A 52 Week, Double-Blind, Randomized, Placebo-Controlled Trial to Evaluate the Efficacy of Orlistat Plus Diet in Obese Hypertensive Patients Inadequately Controlled with Antihypertensive Medications(s)
